European Studies in Munich, Berlin and Vienna [August 3 - 26, 2016]

We are pleased to welcome students from our Chinese partner universities: Peking University, Tsinghua University, Renmin University, Fudan University, Shanghai Jiao Tong University, Tongji University, Zhejiang University to the Munich International Summer University (MISU) in Germany.

The European Studies Program takes place under the patronage of the Center for Applied Policy Research (CAP) at Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München (LMU Munich) in collaboration with Viennese Institute for the Dannube Region and Central Europe as well as the European Academy of Sciences and Arts.

The European Union is the most prominent example on how regional integration works. For 28 countries, supranational and intergovernmental policy-making determines not only their political and economic systems; the global challenges of the 21st century illustrate the limitations of power of individual governments, thus requiring common approaches. As a consequence, integration is also considered important for European security policy and Europe's role in global affairs.

At the same time, however, disagreement on how to deal with conflicts in Europe's eastern and southern neighbourhood, on the handling of refugee flows from the Middle East as well as the still looming sovereign debt crisis seem to show the limits of European strategic consensus and solidarity. Time and again, national particularities appear at odds with the common interests. Public opinion has become less favourable with regard to European cooperation than it had been in the past.

Against this background, the summer academy also analyses the prospects and challenges for finding a new rationale for European Integration. It thereby relates to the broader debates on the future of Europe and the project "Next Europe: In search for its narrative" that has been launched as a collaborative effort by the CAP and the European Academy of Sciences and Arts.

The Munich International Summer University is based on an interdisciplinary approach. It combines different methodologies such as lectures, round-table discussions, group-work and students' presentations along with excursions to meet politicians as well as professionals.

In addition to the academy, we encourage you to engage in a vibrant international student life on the campus of LMU Munich during the summer of 2016.

The Center for Applied Policy Research (CAP) at LMU Munich was founded in 1995 in order to bring together the privately funded, practice-oriented research work attached to the professorship held by Prof. Werner Weidenfeld. Today, the Center is the largest university policy research institute on European and international questions in Germany.

Research Group

The research group on European Affairs focuses its work on strategies for the future of the European Union. The group also concentrates on the current process of European integration and on specific regions and countries like the Black Sea, the Middle East or the United States and Russia. Especially important and characteristic for the group is the combination of research on both institutional processes and developments in policies like energy or research and development, justice and home affairs, foreign policy or transatlantic relations. Mr. Schäffer holds an Honor's Master's degree in East European studies (major: legal studies, minor: history) from the University of Regensburg and an M.A. degree from LMU, where he studied political science, European law, and Slavonic studies.

Academic Information

Target Group

The program addresses to students with different academic backgrounds (minimum: 1 year of study) and a general interest in European integration will benefit from each other in an intercultural and interdisciplinary learning process.

The course requires a general knowledge about European politics, law, history or culture. Participants should be interested in more than just their field of specialization. In class participation, especially in the discussions with experts, is essential for the course success and plays an important role in grading.

Grading Procedure

There are three grading sections in this course:

- Essay (approx. 3500-4000 words) = 55 %
- Presentation = 25 %
- Active participation in class = 20 %

<u>Credit</u>

The Academic Board of the MISU defines the requirements and contact hours (1 contact hour comprises 45 minutes) for successful completion of the courses as follows:

- regular attendance (6 lessons max. absence)
- preparation for and active participation in seminars
- attendance and contribution to lectures
- participation in and contribution to class excursions
- self-study and homework assignments
- written assignments; essay with 3500-4000 words, sent be email; deadline will be August 10th, 2016
- presentations

Transcripts

Every student will receive an official transcript after the successful completion of all program requirements. The transcript will show the course name and contact hours, the number of acquired credits as well as the achieved grades.

Housing in Munich

LMU Munich is able to offer accommodation for the participants in student residential halls of the Studentenwerk München. Each student is accommodated in his own private room. Almost every apartment is equipped with a small kitchen.

During your stay in all 3 cities, you will be responsible for providing meals for yourself. Lunch can be purchased for \in 5-7 everywhere. Kitchens can also be used for the preparation of meals. You will also have a fridge to store food in.

VISA

After successful application and payment of fees, the applicant receives an invitation letter from the MISU program. This letter entitles the student to apply for German visa for the duration of the program if needed.

Note: Please start the visa application process minimum 3 month in advance !!!

Health Insurance

During your stay in Europe and maybe for visa application students need to be covered by a German-approved health insurance policy. The MISU program recommend the Klemmer Assekuranz. The costs are approx. $30 \in$ for one month and the insurance is valid in all Europe.

Payment

Tuition includes the following:

Program Costs

Each student has to pay in total 1.315,00 € (approx. 10.000 RMB):

- € 150,00 MISU registration fee
- € 775,00 course fee (LMU / CAP)
- € 390,00 housing fee (student dorm)

Conditions of Cancellation

Students can cancel the course booking subject to the following conditions:

<u>Cancellation after first payment:</u> The registration fee is not refundable. If accommodation was booked, the deposit for the rent may not be refunded.

Cancellation 4 weeks before commencement of the course:

The registration fee is not refundable.

If accommodation was booked, the deposit for the rent may not be refunded and 50% of the course deposit fees may not be refunded.

Cancellation 1 day before commencement of the course:

The registration fee is not refundable.

If an accommodation was booked, the deposit for the rent may not be refunded and 80% of the deposit for the course fees may not be refunded.
