Stanford Summer Session

International Honors Program (IHP)

June 20 – August 16, 2026 (8 Weeks)

Stanford's International Honors Program (IHP), part of Stanford Summer Session (SSS), offers visiting students a residential experience on campus during the summer, blending world-class academics with co-curricular activities. The program immerses students in Stanford's intellectual ecosystem while exploring the Bay Area's cultural and natural resources.

The "Stanford Factor"

IHP students describe the experience as transformative, inspiring them to become global leaders and innovators.

Program Highlights

- Open to undergraduate and graduate students, earning official Stanford academic credit.
- Key areas of study include innovation, computer science, natural sciences, and humanities.
- IHP Students study alongside matriculated Stanford and SSS visiting students.

IHP Residence

IHP students live in an IHP-designated residence with unique programming designed especially for them. Sharing their cultures and backgrounds exposes them to new ideas, thoughts, and perspectives, creating a unique community with friendships that can last a lifetime.

Program Requirements


- Selected by a partner institution
- Minimum GPA: 3.0
- Must be at least 18 years old and have completed at least one term of university
- Verified English fluency
- Enroll in at least 8 units (7 from academic departments)

Costs

Application and program fees are waived for IHP students. In addition, IHP students receive a 20% tuition discount for up to 8 units.

Fees are subject to change.
