Entry requirements

You will have completed at least one year of undergraduate study at the time of joining the UCL Summer School and normally be able to demonstrate an average grade, or equivalent academic experience, of:

// 3.3/4.0 GPA (US scale)
(3.0 for second- or third-year students applying for lower level modules)

// 2.1 (UK scale)

English language requirement

Students who are not nationals of a UK Home Office majority English-speaking country are required to provide evidence of English language proficiency.

About the UCL Summer School

The UCL Summer School is divided into two sessions, each spanning three weeks (dates can be found on the back of this leaflet). You can choose to attend for one or two sessions, and you will study one module per session.

All Summer School modules are taught by UCL academics in interactive participatory groups. Many modules incorporate class visits and guest speakers to further enhance your learning.

As a UCL Summer School student you will have full-time student status and a UCL ID card which entitles you to full borrowing rights in all of our libraries.

With 16 specialist libraries and five permanent collections on campus, and all of London's museums, galleries and monuments within easy reach, you will have a wealth of resources to support your studies.

The UCL Summer School offers over 60 modules from a wide range of subject areas. Many of our modules are introductory, meaning no prior subject knowledge is required, while others have specific entry requirements (level 2 or level 3 modules).

UCL recommends that each module is worth the equivalent of **4 US credits** or **7.5 ECTS**. Students can be guaranteed that each module carries the same academic rigor and workload as a standard UCL undergraduate module. Depending on the regulations at your home institution it may be possible to transfer credits gained to your own degree programme.
